PARTNERING WITH OUR SCHOOLS

RCCF actively engages with schools to identify areas of need and provide targeted support through grants and funding opportunities. Whether it's funding for educational resources, extracurricular activities, or facility improvements, we strive to address the diverse needs of our county's schools to create an optimal learning environment for students.

Over \$30,000 have been awarded to schools in Roscommon County in 2023, including C.O.O.R. Intermediate School District. Grants have helped with field days, athletic equipment, lifesaving medical devices such as AEDs, a cooking club for students, and helped fund band trips and Quiz Bowl trips for our county's students.






